Starter

When the Apostle Paul wrote to the church in Rome it was fractured. Half the Christians were Jewish and the other half were Gentile (non-jewish decent/customs). This was the case in most of the Roman world. The Apostle Paul wrote this letter to get everyone on the same page and to unite them around the greatest truth of all, that Christ is King and the unifier of the people.

In verses 31-35, what are some of the words or phrases Paul uses to describe God?

Describe what a conqueror is? How can someone be 'more' than a conqueror?

How does the love of God make us more than conquerors?

In each of our lives we face things that challenge us greatly. The apostle Paul describes them as "Height nor depth, etc." if you were to rewrite verse 38 and the beginning of verse 39, what are some of the things you might include?

What are some attributes of God's love that are unique to divine love?

Would you consider yourself someone who benefits from the victory we have in Christ Jesus? Why or why not?

What steps can you take to realize your victory in Christ?

How can we pray for each other today?
